Readorium and Response to Intervention (RTI)

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The goal of Response to Intervention (RTI) is to support students at all skill levels in order to meet their educational needs. All students are screened in their regular education classrooms. Those who struggle are provided with interventions at the intensity indicated. Progress is monitored to ascertain the rate of learning and the level of performance for each student. Educational decisions are based on this continual monitoring, and in this way instruction is targeted to student needs because it is guided by ongoing data.

RTI support is generally defined as a three-tier (or three-step) model of supports that use research-based interventions. Readorium supports students on all three RTI tiers as shown in the following chart.

- A demonstration chapter in each book, where the mentor will help a student who struggles by reading and explaining each paragraph, reviewing all questions and answer choices and by discussing why each choice is correct or incorrect, as needed.
- Fact based questions after each paragraph and caption to break up concept density and ensure that struggling students reread complex and/or confusing material. (These questions weed out as students gain proficiency in using strategic thinking to correctly answer questions.)
- Many missing words choices (Cloze technique) in each paragraph to ensure that struggling readers do not gloss over the information but instead remain engaged in reading each sentence carefully so they can make the correct choice.
- A scaffolded hint system designed to teach students how to answer questions independently. Hints are triggered by incorrect an

At this level, students receive individualized, intensive interventions that target the students' skill deficits. Students who do not achieve the desired level of progress in response to these targeted interventions are then referred for a comprehensive evaluation and considered for eligibility for special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act of 2004 (IDEA 2004).

How Readorium Supports Students

- All Readorium students receive individualized, intensive intervention, if needed, as they read. (See above.)
- Readorium data is specific and actionable. Teachers can instantly see which students are struggling with specific types of text and/or with using specific strategic reasoning to construct text meaning.
